

This year's Autumn International Medical Workshop for Paediatric organ Malformation Surgery was held in Chisinau, The Republic of Moldova. Prof. Dr. Thomas Boemers along with Dr. Tobias Klein came from Cologne, Germany, and Dr. Mircea Ardelean from Salzburg, Austria, to lead the workshop. It was combined with a Medical Congress organized by Dr. Natalia Cojusneanu with 99 surgeons from The Republic of Moldova and 150 surgeons from Romania. 5 children were selected for operations to demonstrate the surgical procedures and are all doing well. A wonderful opportunity for the families.




International Medical Workshop

We are happy to have been contacted by the Budila City Hall to tell us about the case of a baby born with double cataract. The medical facility locally sent the child home without treatment and we were called to arrange emergency help in Bucharest to help prevent the child from becoming blind. A great privilege.



In our 2nd case this year the social worker found a boy laying in bed on the verge of death. He was skin and bones, suffering from giardia and also a neurological disease that has him crippled. The city hall called us in a panic asking if we could help. Our nurse volunteer Cornelia offered to help with this case taking it on right away. She made some calls and we were able to get him into the Brasov hospital urgently to treat the giardia first. Brasov is not able to save his leg so that he can walk, but with some more phone calls, Cornelia was able to get him into the specialized hospital in Bucharest and they will do the surgery next week and provide ongoing treatment in the hope to see him walk again.






Kids Camp

keeping children in school and teaching adults literacy

The Mobile Classroom Project is now in its 8th year of operation. This project offers after school programs for children of all ages to help keep them at grade level as well as literacy programs for adults. It provides school supplies, educational field trips, and a daily presence of a qualified educator

who truly cares for the families she works with.

In most of Romania, if a child is not at grade level, there is no option for them but to drop out and take their chances without an education. This means service jobs at the lowest pay-scale which are not enough to live on.



Our program helps to keep a group of over 80 children in school so that they have a real chance at a better future!



After many years, it was time to change out the old unit and thanks to a generous donation, we were able to purchase a new/used one. It makes for a great learning environment!



School Supplies, Socks & Shoes!

Each Fall, there is an expectation for children to arrive to school with a list of supplies which have been pre designed by the local school system. Very much like western schools, this is a standard understanding. The beneficiaries of our program are not always able to afford these things and in fact, don't often have the shoes they need to make the long walk to school. Our Back to School program provides both. The books and writing utensils necessary, and warm shoes for those rainy and snowy days where wet and cold feet can end up in sickness It's a joy for any child to

receive "Back to School" supplies and to have new socks and shoes for the Fall and Winter seasons.
